Horning, or Letters of Horning, is a warrant in the King's name issued out under the Signet, to charge persons to pay money or perform deeds within a prefixed time, upon pain of being Declared Out Laws, and having their goods pinned. 116. in case of Disobedience.

Letters of Horning, are either General, or Special. General letters of Horning, are those obtained upon a bill the Lords of Session, against persons not particularly named but comprehended under some General Designation, as the Executors of a Shire or parish, Inhabitants within a town or burgh. Some General Letters were authorized by Statute others by Customs Acts of Parliament or in Horning, let Directly Summarily against Life-renters to find surety to support the life-rented lands and tenements in the case they receive them Act 25 Par. 3. f. 4. The new General Letters of Horning are granted only for his Majesty's Service, for Ministers Stipends upon warrants of Parliaments, and for making Decrets of finding the ground effectually Act 13. f. 2. Par. 11. 116. Which Decrets of finding the ground are to have Execution as formerly that is, letters of pointing the ground may proceed not only against the persons who are the Executors in possession, but also against their Executors, so long as the obtainer of the Decret and letters of pointing lives: But after his death the same must be transferred against the Executors in possession for the time past.
