Witches exert their Masters command upon the females from him, sometimes by the ordinary ways of going riding or sailing; sometimes by being after they have cast themselves carried in an extraordinary manner through the air, either over land or water very swiftly by force of the evil spirit, Dolrio Bisquisit. For the Devil who took up Christ into the air and let him in a pinacle of the Temple to may ~~so~~ more easily suppose a place to transport those creatures that are his Vassals thither in air. In doing whereof he irritated God who by an Angel carried Habakkuk to the sun where Daniel lay. At the same time it must be owned that the Devil doth often persuade Witches that they are carried to places where they never were, by making impressions upon their brain and acquainting them in a dream what to do. Those of which Imaginary transports only the Canon Episcop. 12. Eust. 2. 6. Qwest. 3 is to be Understood, when it Deceives those wretches who thoughtlessly rode upon Boats thro' the air with Diabolical Power who would, to meetings with the Devil, to be bound only into such a farce by that Evil spirit.

Working on their Imagination. We are told that sometimes the spirits of witches may be Ravished out of their Bodies, and clothed with Bodies made of air and so be carried from one country to another, while their Natural bodies are borne to the still sports left at home, Bonlawn Hist. of Witchcraft Vol. 1 chap. 9 Examination of Isabella Edward. For it is thought by Men of Great Names that there may be a Real separation of the soul from the Body, without death, partly local, which consists not wholly and also entirely in the Actual Division of those two, but in the Indivisibility and Unifinity of the Body for Vital Action. The first is mentioned in the Hypoth. of St. Paul, without the Body or out of the Body. 1 Cor. 15. 42. On this Hypoth. if the witches anointing herself before she takes her flight, may perhaps serve to keep the Body immovable, and in a fit disposition to receive the spiritual substance. It is noted are Bishoppes to receive the spiritual substance corporally transported quickly to fly, but themselves corporally transported myself of Witchcraft Book 1 cap. 1. fol. 6. Bonlawn Hist. of Witchcraft Vol. 2 chap. 1. Royal of G. Bonlawn. Which is not hard for Satan to do by thickening the air under and about them, thus a Witch sailed in a boat like a chimney, the Devil passing before a sea duck of Flay to a ship wherein she entered invisible to the Mariner, drank wind and got other goods from the Devil 25 January 1592 Agnes Lampson.

Diabolical Magick is chiefly employed in Directly buying of persons and their goods and in laying some delual oil and Calumby upon
