to be a Witchy, that a man after he injurid her became
all together poor and upon being so considerd to her

malposed in his worldly estate 20 Decemb; 1661 Agnes Finsbury
began prosperity and Decaying Meane which are the blessed
signe of God in a waye labord in to to his provisioned de-
pend upon him and his selfe try, are impudently ascribed to the
Devil and for evry; Unles it were belloved, that the Devils
Instrument had by some strange accident as fire or
Storm Destroyed such a mans Meane; or hindred his
Employments by taking away from him his Will In-
dustry and skill in working at his trade; or Distracting him
from Employing him who had been formerly in use to do
it. Besides poverty and Prosperity Requiring a Contin-
ued tract of time, cannot be procured by a transient
Charm. Nor yet was it fustain'd Relevant against a
woman, that she had said to those that were the Devil
day to carry a Witch to her trial, was it not a good
Sport if the Devil shoud raise a great wind and take
her from you, and accordingly while they were by the
waye, suddenly tempest of wind arose that did all most
blowe the Company off their feet, and drive the wiche
into a Water so as they could not for a long tyme get
her up againe. In this just such an Expression might
have proceeded from Foly or Jeft or Vanegantia, and
the wiche was not taken from them 10 Septembris 1661
Janet Cock. An Article of witch craft, that a woman lea-
ving borrowed from her Neighbour a faire part of Meale
she by her sorcery took all the substance and strength
from the loft of the London Meale, so that he never
got any good thereof; was not fustain'd Relevant to no
particular Methods of sorcery used for that end by
the borrower being mentioned. Albeit it was plead-
ed, that as the production of corn is from Natural
causes, so the fiftland and spirit of it is from Na-
tural causes, which are well knowne to the Devil:
and the party accused got a parol of the stuffe he
intended to destroy, which is the ordinary practice
of witches for accomplishing their horrid designe
