 Recognizing the Authority of the Pope
 or any foreign power; and Disavowing that
 of the King, or Parliament.

The Extrajudicial Exercise of the Pope's usurped power,
 and his arbitrary disposal of Benefices, &c. having tending might
 to dispossess and weaken the Royal prerogative, by
 withdrawing subjects from their Allegiance to the Sovereign
 and making them depend upon a foreign power, as to the
 for justified in the court of Rome, and thus to their dependence
 upon the faith of Scotland and England; the King
 justly took the Alarms, and not only barred the despotism,
 but even before they stood off the Ham on Spain's Coast, by
 providing against the growth of this usurpation, and
 the effects and consequences were so pernicious and fatal
 to an independent Monarchy, and the highest Honour of
 a free people. Therefore all the Kings his Majesties laws, and
