

Made to ours, and can never be expected to execute these laws, which they think Void, as being Repugnant to the law of God; or to Obey those oaths, which seem to them to have been Ordained for the support of Populigion. He that would see a State of Anarchy and Confusion, should read the History of the late Kings of France, who were not only incapable of offices and places of trust and preferment in the State; but also of profiting or being instructed to be such, and not till they should be removed by taking the formulae, be tutors or Governors, be Admirals, or military Governours & Captains, be Judges of Chamberlains, or Factors; and none dare employ them in such trust, or under the pain of a Year and halfe Rent, or 1000 Markes, if the Valued Rent be less, or the Employer 40 Markes, at the least; nor can a Protestant make a Roman Catholic for his Domestic Servant, under the pain of five Hundred Markes; which pains of a Roman Catholic Rent, 1000 Markes, or 500 Markes, belong as a Reward to the purveyor if a Protestant Act 3.
