

Alimout to such Children out of their own, or out of the
 parent's Moans Act 3 Japh. 889 Parl. K. W. Papist's cannot
 Wrong their Protestant heirs by any Enactment or Statute
 Act 26 Japh. 5 Parl. K. W. Which can affect only the grantors
 own person and Moveables Act 3 Japh. 889 Parl. K. W. They
 are incapable per se to Rescind any Dispositions in their
 favour or to succeed as heirs or by other Conveyances from
 persons they might be heirs to, without purging themselves
 of popery; and in case of their failing to do so, the Succession
 shall to the Next Protestant heirs who are to be found
 as such to the person so devised, and to have Right from
 the said Grantors to the State and Rents, like the person
 excluded or his heir purges himself as above, in which
 case he is to be Rejoined as before the Exclusion, the
 Intervening Rents with the Burden of the Current
 Annual Rents of debts Remaining with the Protestants
 Successors; which Exclusion is to be without prejudice to
 Creditors before the Exclusion. The Protestant to whom
 the Succession falls, by the Exclusion, must purgify
 his right within two Years, or as oft as good to the Next
 and so forth. The Papist and his heir must Rejoine
 Popery within ten Years (without Rescinding Minors
 after the Intestacy, or is to be Excluded from the estate
 forever, and the estate goes to the Next Protestant heir
 With all such lawful Conditions and Burdens Act 3 Japh.
 889 Parl. K. W. Deeds in Favour of Catholics or other
 Popish Societies, are Void, and Grants to the Grantors
 Next Protestant heirs. No Repudiation or other
 ground is competent to a Papist, upon any gratuitous
 bond or Deed: Nor can any Repudiation Expire in his
 person; but an Repudiation coming from a Papist
 into the person of a Protestant, after the legal
 time, expires after Year and day. A Protestant buying
 Papist by profession or practice, forfeits his estate
 immediately to his Next Protestant heir, as if he
 were dead: Without prejudice to lawful
 Anterior Creditors of both as to the person apostatizing
 himself in his estate and Succession therein in any

any sort. Which Next heir if Widow regularly, is to be
 Rejoined Protestant when a Child's Education is such, and is

Chap. 6.
 of Nonconformity.

Nonconformity is a Protestant Dissent from the Establi-
 shed Church, upon the Account of its Discipline and Govern-
 ment, by persons called Dissenters or Nonconformists, who have
 had its Rise from a Declaration of King Charles the
 first who appointed all the Bishops of Great Britain and
 England to have the same Ceremonies and Discipline; the
 a quietness therein or Dissenting from which, is term'd
 Nonconformity and Nonconformity.

The Nonconformists or Protestant Dissenters in England
 are the Presbyterians, Anabaptists, Quakers &c.
 The Presbyterians these were once Exposed to the highest
 of Laws made for keeping Conventicles and not Reporting
 to their parish Church to hold Communion according to

 Year 1689 that severity was taken off, and an Act to serve
 said Conditions in the Exercise of Religion in England, is
 an effectual Means to Unite English Protestants in the most
 and affection: provided they take the oath in the
 1 M. 2. cap. 8 and subscribe the Declaration against Popery
 in the 36 Car. 2 cap. 1 before the Justices of peace at their
 general session; the places of their assembly for Religious
 worship be Certified to the Bishops of the Dioceses to the
 Arch Deacon or to the Justices of peace at their quar-
 ter sessions, and Records thereof, and provided the doors
 be not locked barred or bolted during their Meeting,
 and that they pay tithes or other parochial duties
 to the Church or Minister and if Obsolete to any paro-
 chial officer, may executed by a Justices. Parishes their
