

Satisfy it, the offender is liable to be transported to the
 Plantations for seven years. But this prohibition of keep-
 ing or wearing arms, is not extended to Bers or Bow-fans,
 or to any officers Employed in the Execution of Justice, or
 their assistants, or to Commission officers of the Army and
 the frontiers under their Commands. And any Commoner
 qualified to Vote at Elections of Parliament Men for any
 of the above Counties, is not hindered to keep or use two pistols
 two pair of Pistols, two Swords; nor the Magistrate of
 every burgh Royal to have in their Magazine a suffi-
 cient Number of Arms not Exceeding 200 for keeping guard
 within their burghs to be used according to their Direction
 by the Militants keeping guard. Contractors of Companies
 their Populace, the Militia and Genl's Men under their
 Commands are also allowed to receive Arms out of his
 Majesty's Magazines, and to use the same during the
 time that the Militia and Genl's Men are called out by
 lawful Authority; but are to Return such Arms within
 20 days after Expiration of the time for which they were
 called out, under the penal ties above mentioned (G. i.
 cap. 24. 25. 26. 27. 28. 29. 30.)

And the provision is not Made for the More Effec-
 tual Securing the Highlands of Scotland, and for the Sup-
 plies for securing the peace and quiet of that part of the King

Cap. 9.
 Breaches of the Publick peace.

The law gives have made fearful provision both for
 preventing breaches of the peace, and for punishing the
 peace breakers.
