

The Clerk doth not bid a prisoner for Mispriision of high treason hold up his hand at the time of his pleading to it (that Crime not being felony) but tells him he standes indicted of Mispriision of high treason by the Name of ~~the~~ for that he did as in the Indictment. And askes him whethre he be guilty of that offence of Mispriision, or not guilty? If he answer not guilty the Clerk enters on the Indictment over his Name, per adjournment &c. directed. Or if he confess, signe without asking him how he woulde be tried. And then bids the keeper takes him from the Barre.

As soon as the prisoners hath pleaded Not guilty four of the Justices or Commissioners (unius quatuor) may signe and seal a writ or pro cert called a Venerie facias for summons a jury of 12 good Lawfull Men do vicente of the Neighbours hood in the county or place where the Crime was committed, who are supposed to know the fact betwixt to appear before them at a certain day and place to be upon the trial. This writ is Directed to the Sheriff of the County, or baillif of some liberty or Stewart of some baillif for Stewart to whom it shalbe directed, it must be shewed out to the Coroners, Myles prade Reg. for those who return the Juries must be porsonal not liable to any suspition of partiality
A Venerie facias to the Sheriff must thus

When a stranger isto be tried, he may before theyre copie is shewed for calling a Jury pay the Sheriff to allow him the Benefit of trial per Mosciation Lingue, that is, for persons whose of the one half are aliens if so many Aliens can be had 27 Edw. 3 cap. 8. 28 Edw. 3 cap. 13. & 16 caps. 29, which is called a party Jury. These aliens need not to be freeholders, or to be all of the same Nation with the party to be tried, but every one may be of a different Nation Myles Pract. Reg. 341. Hawkyns pl. Cr. lib. 2 chap. 43 § 35 but the English half of the Jury ought to have testimonies to the same value as in other cases Hawkyns ibid. However no Mosciation Lingue is allowed to an Alien directed of high treason Fullon cap. 193. b. Hale pl. Cr. Hist. of Justice cap. Vol. 2. pag. 271. 260. Hawkyns ibid. § 37. The King may, if he think fit make a special grant to an Alien to be tried for treason by a Jury whereof the one half shall be aliens Hawkyns lib. 2. cap. 13. Trial per Mosciation Lingue is not judiciable to those Outlandish Vagabonds who call themselves Egyptians 1302 Pl. & M. cap. 953. Nor can any Alien have advantage of trial per Mosciation Lingue, unless he pay for it in time before the return of a Common Venerie, for he cannot have the Advantage of it by way of Processe, Hale pl. Cr. 261. Hawkyns ibid. § 40. But if on account of half Saxon and half Alien, the Sheriff return
