of Legal Checks to Unlawfull gaming
and Wagering.

All Gaming for Money at plays of fortune, as Cards, Dice, tables &c. is prohibited by the Civil law l. 2 s. 17 & do Aleatoribus. Which the Doctor entituled to such Gaming for goods or any other profitable thing, Prosp. Gram. do var. ac Divers. Brim. pag. 109 n. 42. Because thereby one becomes Archer by another loss, and Covets but Hough bound thing. Besides, that it occasions frequently profane swearing, blasphemy and quarrells. There are several legal Checks to Unlawfull Gaming. Wz. the Master of the house where Unlawfull gaming is used may according to the Civil law be offended summing during the time of playing l. 1 pr. & do Aleator. Capizzi. Bid. n. 23. Contract bonds or Wagers made at such Unlawfull Gaming, are null, Prosp. Gram. Bid. n. 203 & seqq. By the Scotch law what is lost upon such a bet that Game, cannot be pursued; and any Money so lost and paid, cannot be sought back to. Woolf. Gram. ad. 6. & do Aleator. n. 6. nor are justic. & graft effectively bound to do. Bid. By
